

Stuart Batty: *Demonstration* *and* *Class Schedule*

The Stuart Batty hands on classes will be held in the shop of Jimmie Gill, 3425 Meadow Oaks Drive, Haltom City, TX 76117, from 9 AM until 4 PM each day beginning Thursday, April 12 through



Thursday, April 19. The all day demonstration will take place on Saturday, April 14 from 9 AM until 4 PM at our regular monthly meeting location: R. D. Evans Recreation Center, 3242 Lackland Road, Fort Worth. If you are not certain about the

dates you are scheduled for classes or if you have any other questions, contact John Horn by either e-mail at johnhorn@flash.net or by phone at 817-485-7397 or cell number 817-944-3993 if he is not at home.

If you have not already paid the class fee, it is due no later than club meeting day on March 29. Any registration not paid by that time will be cancelled and the open position will be offered to those who have signed the waiting list in the order of their application.

If you would like to help in preparing the wood, we need approximately 375 pieces of wood cut to fill the needs of the classes. Wayne Clowers, Stormy Boudreaux, Jimmie Gill, and I have already made a dent in the pile that needs to be cut but there is still much left to prepare. Your assistance would certainly be appreciated. Contact us if you can help.

If you have registered for a class, the following information will help you prepare the things that you will need. The tools that you need are the same for a typical one or two day class.

Please find below the list of tools and wood needed for the 2 Day Technique class.

Tools Used in the Two-Day Techniques Class

Stuart has spares if you do not have all these tools:

- Spindle Roughing Gouge - 3/4" or larger
- Skew Chisel - 1/2" or larger
- Spindle Gouge - 3/8"
- Beading and Parting Tool - 3/8"
- Parting Tool - any size is OK
- Bedan - 3/8"
- Bowl Gouge - 3/8" and any larger ones you have

Additional Note for advanced students:

If you are an advanced student and/or have taken classes with Stuart before, be assured he will have special projects for you to work on in addition to or instead of any techniques the rest of the class may be working on. Stuart is quite adept at working with several skill levels in a class of six people. If you are taking a one day class only, you will still gain a great deal from studying under what I consider as the best teacher on the planet. If you are taking classes of more than two days, you will find this experience especially rewarding.

When you bring the piece to be displayed, please have the piece packed adequately for the protection of the turned object. Some of the membership will transport the pieces to the library. After the end of the display period, the turnings will be returned to you at the next monthly meeting. Let's continue our great support that we have with the NRHPL and bring your favorite or your best piece to the March meeting.

The library is located at 6720 N E Loop 820 near the Southeast corner of Rufe Snow and Loop 820 in North Richland Hills.
