

The September program, “Legs & Lids” will be presented by Ralph Watts, a retired mechanical engineer and a lifelong woodworker and carver who “turned” to the lathe about six years ago to facilitate his interest in turned wood art.

Ralph Watts has had pictures of his work published in the AAW Journal (Witch's Stash & Fraternal Twins) and Wood Turning Design (Triffid). His forte is enhancing his lathe work by carving, burning, and texturing to create fanciful wood sculptures. Inspiration for his work is derived mostly from

nature (e.g. pollen, seeds, roots, bats). Ralph is the program chair for the Smoky Mountain Woodturners in Knoxville, Tennessee and frequently demonstrates various techniques and tools.

The “Empty Bowls Project”

Woodturners of North Texas has adopted the Empty Bowls project as our primary community service activity for this year. The North Texas and Tarrant Area Food Banks are asking for bowls to benefit those without adequate food for this very popular annual fund raising drive ... Empty Bowls, “An Artful Luncheon to Fight Hunger” is a donation program where woodworkers, pottery, and glass workers make bowls, which are donated for this activity.

Turning a bowl is a project that any and all of us can complete and present with pride. Every member of the Woodturner’s of North Texas is being encouraged to participate and to turn and donate bowls that will be sent to the Empty Bowl project. You are encouraged to participate and set your own personal goal for the number of bowls that you will contribute to this worthy cause. Last year, Max Taylor set an enviable pace by completing a total of 19 bowls and several other members were not far behind in the number of bowls that they turned.

It only takes a block of wood, sharp tools, safety glasses and a desire to participate in this very worthwhile activity. If you plan to participate in this activity, you are encouraged, in keeping with the spirit of the project which is to eliminate hunger, to please turn bowls -- something that could be easily perceived as a bowl assuming a bit of artistic license when necessary.

We will keep track of the numbers of bowls completed and make a monthly report in the newsletter of those contributing club members and the total number of bowls turned. Your contribution, combined with the efforts of all of our club members and the other Metroplex clubs can make a significant difference to those in need.

by incorporating carved legs and how to make oriental style lids for your boxes. Multiple options for legs and lids will be shown and discussed.

Many of Ralph’s bowls and turnings incorporate legs of various styles but all are created in a similar fashion. Ralph will show the turning and measuring process to rough out legs then shape and carve them to a final shape ready for sanding.



For the Lids part of the program, Ralph will demo a square, dished lid similar to

those that Ray Key uses in his oriental box series. However, Ralph’s method is a simplified version and incorporates some additional options for use in other turnings.
