The very first ducks were turned with these chucks. They worked well until one of the chucks exploded while turning. That's when it was determined that PVC should not be used off center. with very sharp edges and is very dangerous. That put an end to my duck turning, or anything off center with PVC, until I could come up with a safer method of doing it. The demonstration for this month will be how to use the ShapeShifter Chuck in turning off center ducks safely, and how the chuck works. We will explore a couple different ways of holding wood on the chuck along with ways to reduce the weight for reduced vibration. The chuck is very versatile and can be used to turn a variety of items off center: bowls, pens and bottle stoppers for example. The one concern that you will need to address is the speed at which your lathe will allow for off center turning before it "walks" via vibration. At the AAW convention last year in Hartford, Ct I met Dan Hoffman of Offcenter-Tools and was introduced to his ShapeShifter Chuck. After discussing with him my desire to find a safe way to turn off center he convinced me to try his chuck. It turned out to be the solution that I was looking for and is a safer way to turn off center.

R.I.S.E. Adventure 2011




