The classes will address all skill levels from beginners through advanced in the different classes. Registration for the classes will start at the club meeting this Thursday. The following is the current schedule of the Trent Bosch Hands-On Classes:

Fundamentals class: Friday April 20th

Bowls and Platters

Special focus on Sharpening and uses for the swept back grind bowl gouge

Two day class Mixed abilities: Sunday and Monday, April 22nd & 23rd

We will have time to cover a variety of topics on the master list

Intermediate class: Tuesday, April 24th

Hollow forms

Focus on good design and forms getting clean cuts and consistent wall thicknesses

as well as carving on turnings

Advanced class: Wednesday, April 25th

Designing forms to be carved for an intended effect - Participants can make Vessels of illusions or other pieces similar to mine or explore their own ideas within the realm of the class

Below is a master list of topics that may be explored during any of the workshops:

- Turning open forms
- Getting comfortable with the 1/2" swept back grind gouge
- Different grinds to minimize sanding
- Wood selection (what to look for and why)
- Using Green Wood
- Drying options (Kiln, Air, and other ideas)
- How to cut the wood for best figure
- Enclosed forms (Vessels of Illusion etc.)
- Tools for Hollowing
- Judging wall thickness (Look, Listen, and feel etc.)
- Form (what is good form?)
- Turning pieces that will be carved on (leaving enough wood etc.)
- Wood Manipulation

Carving Wood

Sandblasting wood

- Surface treatments

Ways to achieve the desired effect in your work

Color, texture, etc.

- Finishing (lots of options)
- Whatever area you want to explore further
- Slides of work if applicable
- Look and discuss work created and techniques used

On January 20th, at the Binion Elementary School in Richland Hills, Bob Clark, Glynn Cox, John Horn, Sandy Jarrell, John Lauderbaugh, Ray Moyer, Ronnie Nuzum, Steve Tolar, and Bob Wiggins spent the day helping 72 fifth grade students make candlesticks as a part of the Fine Arts Day program at the school.

There were six 45 minute sessions in which 12 students in each class would each produce their project. 
ing “coaches” each student was able to experience the joy and pride of making a useful item on the lathe that they could take home and display for the whole family to admire.
