In addition to the classes, there are other activities planned for the Gathering and Gallery Room; including a recipe swap lead by Trudy Edwards and coffee time chats.

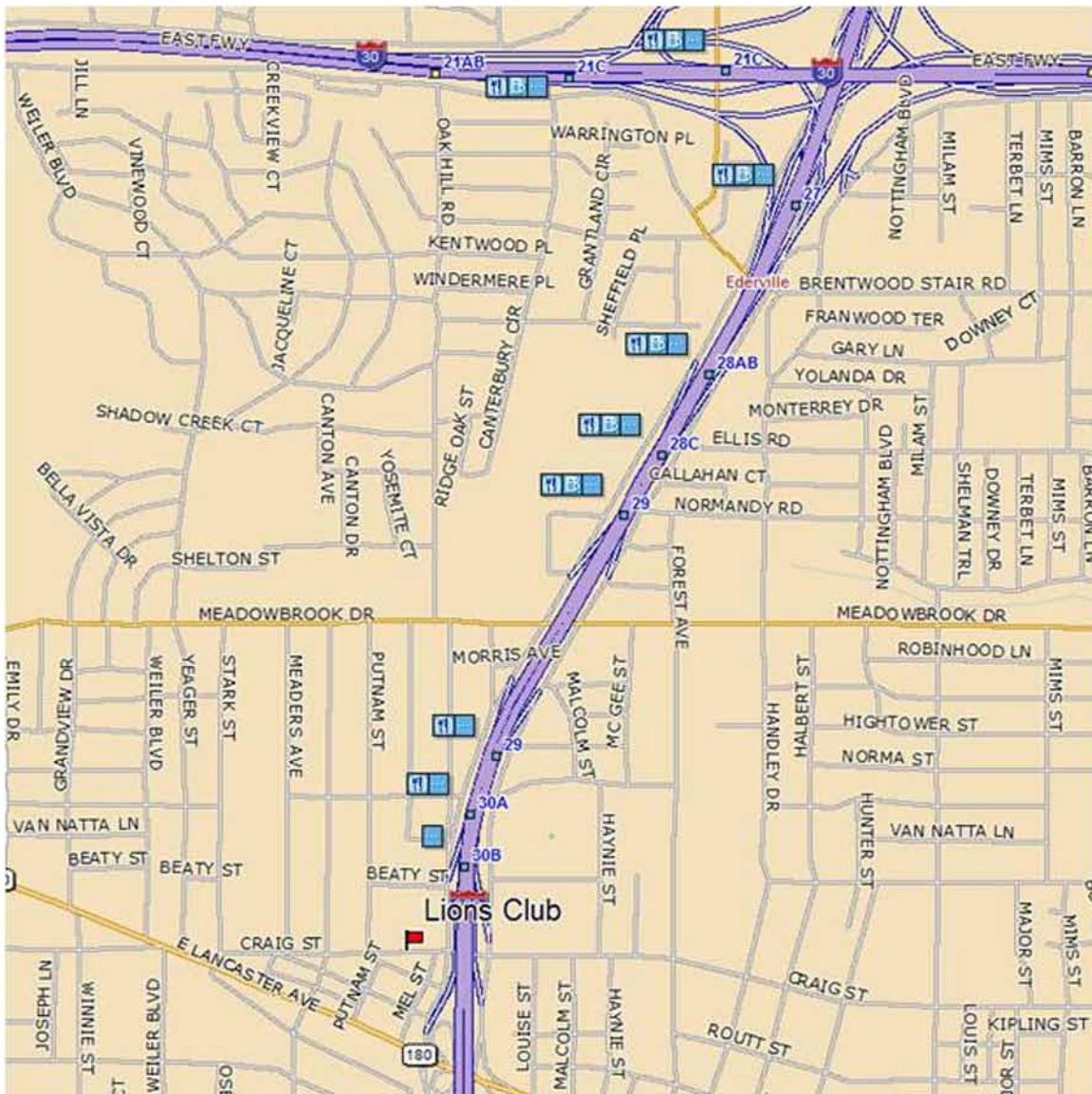
