Johnny & Marcia will be doing a dual demonstration.

Johnny will demonstrate how he turns thin Maple disks for Christmas Ornaments. The disk, when finished, will be about 1/8 inch thin or thick depending on how you call it.

Johnny will demonstrate the use of the Hunter micro tool and the shaping of the disk.

He will discuss how he prepares the maple wood to save time and wood. He will then go through the process of turning one side, sanding that to a very smooth finish. The sanding will be by the power sanding method,

- The end of year months are going to be busy for everyone, especially woodturners. There is always a rush getting that special Christmas gift or tree ornament finished before it gets too cold to keep a gouge from becoming a chatter tool. So now is the time to create that special piece to donate to the club's Christmas auction.

Our club's Christmas dinner and auction on December 14th is one of the highlights of the year. We set up every table available, with several loaded with food and deserts. I know we have one variable speed mini lathe and I saw James Haynes at SWAT with armloads of donated items for door prizes and raffles. The auction is the main attraction, where we finally get a chance to own a special piece turned by a fellow member. As I mentioned at last meeting, the proceeds from the auction provide the major income for our club. Last year we did a little over \$7000. I think we can beat that this year. Our dues do not come anywhere near covering our expenses so this auction is vitally important to the club.

although hand sanding could be used if one wishes. Johnny will then use his alternate method to turn the other side and sand it smooth also. He will discuss the use of a vacuum system, but as some do not have a vacuum system he will only talk of that procedure. Questions are encouraged throughout the demonstration.

Johnny will then turn the demonstration over to Marcia who will explain how she decorates the disks with pyrography. Marcia will cover patterns, burning tips, finishing, and other secrets that you will not want to miss. At the end of the duo's demonstration, there will be a hands-on time period for those who want to try the Hunter tool and/or ask Marcia any questions.



Open Shop

The Woodturners of North Texas will be having an Open Shop on club meeting day, Thursday, October 31st from 4:00 PM until 6:00 PM before the regular meeting. The main emphasis of this event will be on making bowls, especially for Empty Bowls. It would be good for you to be there to learn some of the fundamentals and finer points of bowl turning and design. If you are especially interested in some other phase of woodturning, someone should be there to help you.

A sharpening station will be available for you to learn some of the essentials of keeping your tools sharp. Trying to turn wood with dull tools is not fun nor is it safe.

If you could bring a mini lathe and some bowl gouges it would really be helpful. Let me know if you can bring a lathe.

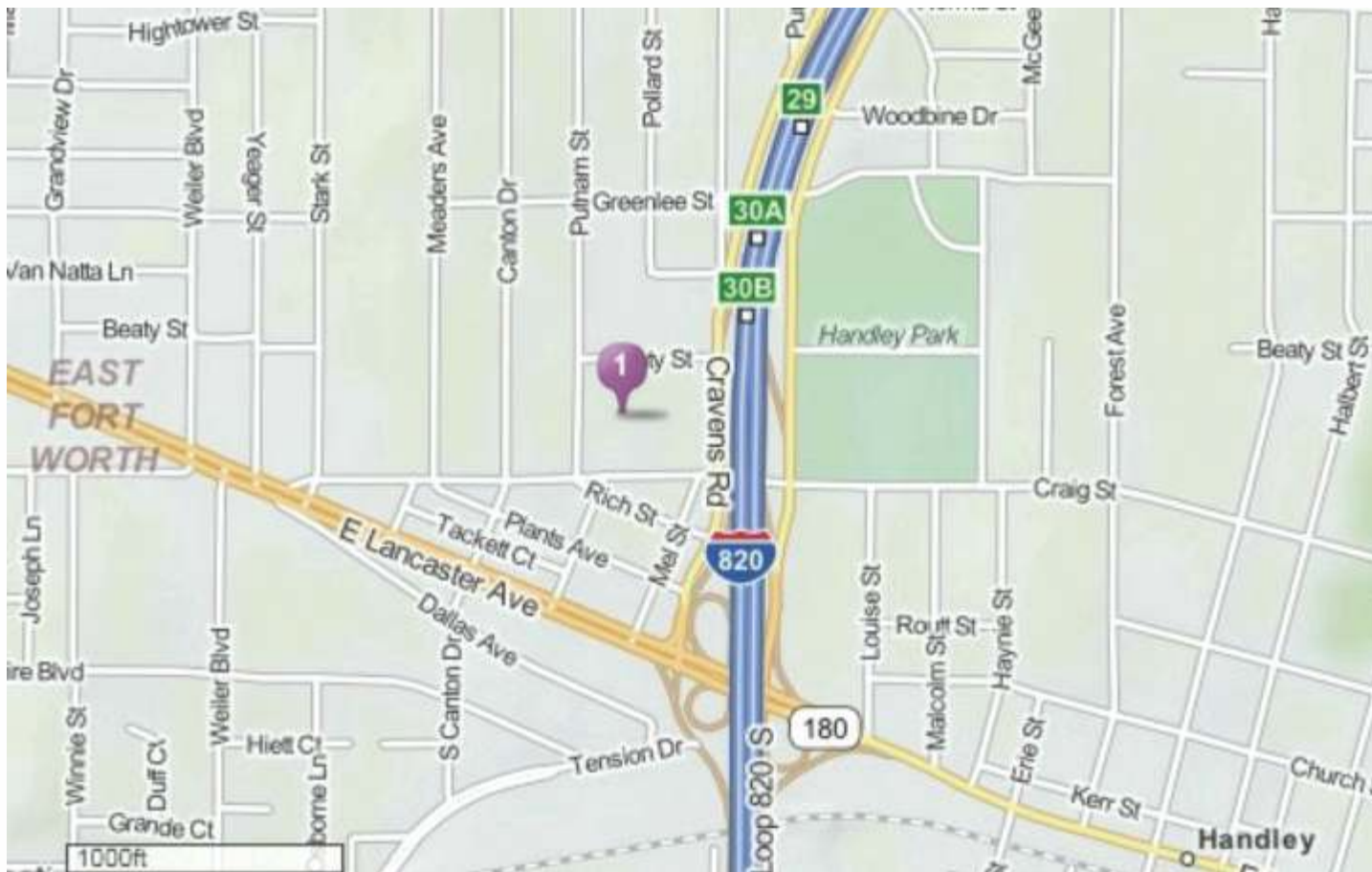
