Joe Ruminski Spring Demnstrator



Our Spring Instructor/Demonstrator will be Joe Ruminski, one of the very popular demonstrators that is really making a name for himself wherever he goes. He will be with the Woodturners of North Texas from

May 12th through May 17th with five all-day classes, starting on May 12th and an all-

day demonstration on May 17th. Start making your plans now to take one or more of the all-day classes because there will only be six people in each class. Joe will teach a wide variety of subjects in the classes with usually two projects in each class. There will be classes for all skill





levels, from beginners to advanced turners. Registration will begin at the February meeting. More details are available on the next page.

Joe Ruminski Spring Demnstrator

Every year the Woodturners of North Texas brings in a very special demonstrator/instructor to both give a number of all-day hands-on classes and provide an all-day demonstration that will inform, educate, and entertain you. This year we are proud to bring you Joe Ruminski from Fairview, North Carolina. Joe has demonstrated at SWAT, taught at Arrowmont and the John C. Campbell Folk School, and is fast becoming one of the most recommended demonstrator/instructors in the country. He travels over the United States providing instruction to clubs full time.

We have him scheduled for five days of classes starting on Monday, May 12th and ending with an all-day demonstration on Saturday, May 17th. You may sign up for one or more of his classes at the club's monthly meeting on February 27th for only \$125 per class. Each class is designed for a specific skill level from the absolute beginning level, the intermediate level, the upper intermediate level, and the advanced level.

In each class you will turn two projects, something you can accomplish with pride as you finish the class.

On Monday, May 12th, <u>a class for turners with little or no experience</u>, you will turn a Basic Bowl and a Tea Light. You will learn the fundamental techniques of using a bowl gouge on these projects.

On Tuesday, May 13th, the class is for <u>students that need to be able to turn a basic bowl with no</u> concern as you turn a Natural Edge Bowl and a False Hollow Form.

On Wednesday, May 14th, for <u>upper intermediate skill level students</u>, you should be comfortable with turning traditional bowls with no concern as you turn an Off-Center Bowl and a Side Grain Box.

On Thursday, May 15th, for <u>upper intermediate skill level students</u>, you should be comfortable with turning traditional bowls with no concern as you turn a Square Rim Bowl (it is not as hard as it sounds) and a Tear Drop Vase (hollowing through the bottom.)

On Friday, May 16th, <u>for advanced skill level students</u>, you will turn a Mini Cowboy Hat and an Off-Center Multi-Center Disk Wall Hanging.

Remember that only six people are allowed in each class and out of over 100 club members only 30 will be able to take one of the hands-on classes. We only have February, March, and April to fill up the classes. At this point, only paid up club members may register for a class but any class that is not full by the April meeting will be open to anyone with the registration fee. If a class becomes full, you may sign up as an alternate in case someone has to withdraw from the class. The class fee needs to be paid to James Haynes at the time of your registration unless prior arrangements have been made.
