SMITHFIELD ELEMENTARY SCHOOL FINE ARTS DAY PROJECT

On Friday, January 30th, twelve members of the Woodturners of North Texas will bring six mini lathes to the Smithfield Elementary School Fine Arts Day event in North Richland Hills where four different classes of fourth and fifth grade students will turn and finish candle sticks under the supervision of the twelve instructor/coaches. Listed below in alphabetical order are the club members that will participate from the WNT: Tom Beatty, Ken Cardin, Bob Clark, Glynn Cox, Rick Gauthier, John Horn, John Lauderbaugh, Ray Moyer, Ronny Nuzum, Jeff Robbins, Pam Thompson, and Bob Wiggins.

In each session emphasis is placed on safety by insisting that each student wear safety glasses and a dust mask while working at the lathe. The students then turn the material that had been prepared by Glynn Cox, John Lauderbaugh, Ronny Nuzum, and John Horn. The students will make candle sticks of their own design with the supervision of their coaches. During the oral presentation in the sessions, the turnings of the instructors will be shown and each turner tells about some of the features of the particular items the students are viewing. Since many schools today no longer teach wood shop classes, we feel it is important that the students be exposed to the joys of woodturning. As a result of our efforts, we are able to see some of the students' parents express an interest in finding out more about the WNT and possibly becoming a member of the organization.

The Fine Arts Day program at the school is held each year to give the students hands-on experience in a variety of artistic activities that are not available in their normal curriculum. The various sessions include painting, dancing, balloon art, music, pottery, woodturning, and other fine art activities.

JIMMY CLEWES TO PROVIDE HANDS-ON CLASSES AND ALL-DAY DEMO

Sign up at the January 29th meeting for one or more of his classes.

Each year the Woodturners of North Texas invites a demonstrator/instructor of international reputation to give an all-day demonstration and usually five days of hands-on classes. This year there will be a class for turners that are just starting out, three classes for the intermediate skilled person, and one class for the advanced turner that would enjoy a real challenge. More information will be given about the content of each class at the meeting on January 29th.

Since Jimmy Clewes is one of the most popular demonstrator/instructors in the world today, we expect the classes to fill up very quickly. Only 30 class positions are available for our 100 plus members of the WNT. The class fee is only \$150 for a full day session. Hands-on classes are on Monday-Friday, April 13-17, and the all-day demo is on Saturday April 18th.

Jimmy is not your ordinary woodturner. Upon a first meeting one would think of him as a renegade, a free thinker and not within the stereotypical image of a woodturner. His charming British style, unending wit, creative mind and magnetic personality are only some of the attributes that make him popular in the woodturning demonstration circuit.
