He mainly worked on his house, built cabinets, computer tables ...etc. In 2008 he had a need for a turned piece for one of his projects and had several friends with lathes attempt to make it but was not satisfied with the results. He broke down and bought a midi lathe and some tools from Harbor Freight and made the piece he needed.

When his father came out to visit from California they took a class at Woodcraft and they both were hooked on wood turning. He has since made, or attempted to make as many different types of projects as possible including a couple segmented boxes for Beads of Courage, lidded boxes and kitchen utensils. John says "I love pushing my limits and learning".

Guidelines:

In order to hold the beads, turned boxes for the Beads of Courage program need to be about 6 inches in diameter (5 inches minimum), rectangular lidded boxes about 4x6x4 inches.

If possible, have Beads of Courage engraved or burned in the lid.

Make sure the lids are easily removable.

Also, finials should be easy for a small child to grasp and not too elaborate.
