Bowls and Jigs by Tod Raines



In this bowl turning demonstration, I'll show a couple of jigs for processing logs at the bandsaw. Then I'll show a couple of different methods of holding blanks on the lathe for traditional and natural edge bowls. I will also show different tools used to make essential cuts in the wood.

Bowl turning is fun and easy. I enjoy the fluid movements and relaxation I get out of turning a bowl. Since the club is asking everyone to help create bowls for the 'Empty Bowls' project I thought this would be a good demo topic.

I started woodworking in the early 1990's making furniture and built-in cabinets for our home. I bought my first lathe in 2002 and was self-taught

for the first couple of years. I then got involved with the Dallas Area Woodturners (DAW) club and the American Association of Woodturners, which was a big help in exposing me to all kinds of turning and training. I am now the treasurer for the DAW club and will continue to serve on the board for the next few years. I am also the Vice Chair on the City of Allen Public Art Committee.

I have learned a lot about turning by watching club demos, taking some classes, going to SWAT and visiting with other turners. I also read a lot, watched a bunch of YouTube videos and practiced and practiced.

After being in the tech industry for 23 years, I now own and operate the Woodturning Tool Store, an online retailer dedicated to providing quality tools and equipment to the wood turning community.

Smithfield Elementary School Fine Arts Day Project

On Friday, January 26th, several members of the Woodturners of North Texas will bring six mini lathes to the Smithfield Elementary School Fine Arts Day event in North Richland Hills where four different classes of fourth and fifth grade students will turn and finish candle sticks under the supervision of the instructor/coaches.

In each session emphasis is placed on safety by insisting that each student wear safety glasses and a dust mask. The students will make candle sticks of their own design with the supervision of their coaches. During the oral presentation in the sessions, the turnings of the instructors will be shown and each turner tells about some of the features of the particular items the students are viewing. Since many schools today no longer teach wood shop classes, we feel it is important that the students be exposed to the joys of woodturning. As a result of our efforts, we are able to see some of the students' parents express an interest in finding out more about the WNT and possibly becoming a member of the organization.

The Fine Arts Day program at the school is held each year to give the students hands-on experience in a variety of artistic activities that are not available in their normal curriculum. The various sessions include painting, dancing, balloon art, music, pottery, woodturning, and other fine arts activities.

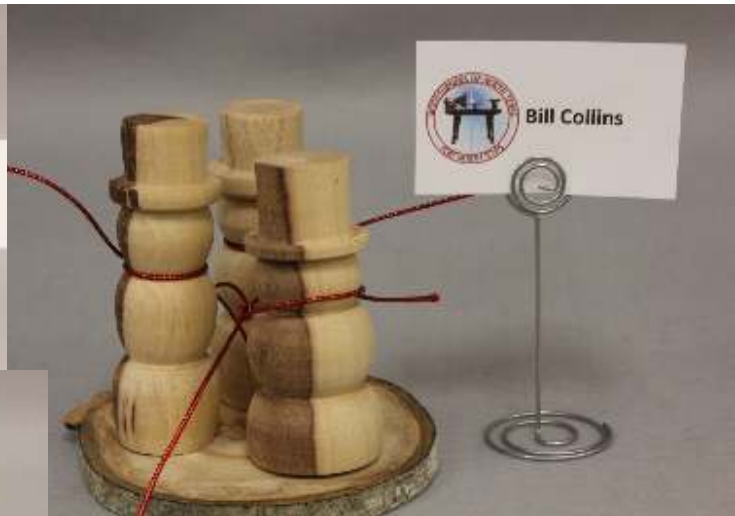

Last Month's Challenge: — Banquet Table Decorations —









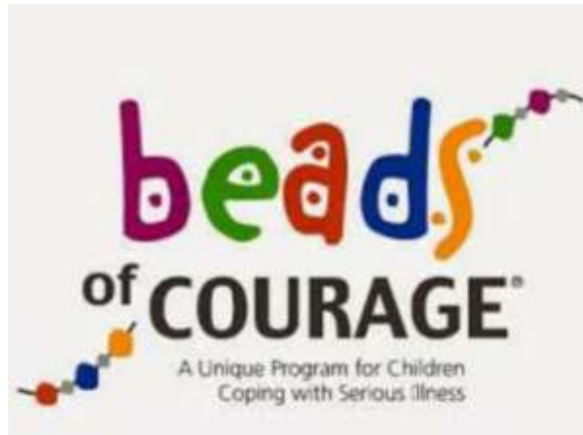


Last Month's Critique

Turnings for Critique

Each month we have a Critique table where members can bring in items they have turned for a constructive critique of their turning. We encourage all members, especially members new to turning, to submit their turnings for critique. One of our members who is recognized as being an “expert” turner does the critique. The objective is to provide constructive input to help members develop their skills. All of us learn from the critiques.

Due to time constraints at the meetings and inputs from membership, a Board member will select three (3) items to be critiqued. However, we encourage members to bring turnings since all of our membership learns by looking and touching someone else's turnings.



It is time start thinking of making a lidded bowl (box) to donate to Cooks Children's in Fort Worth or if needed to Dallas hospital.

Stop by Beads of Courage table and pick up an information sheet on what is required. If you have any questions please see either Ron Howe or Ray Moyer.

There are no changes in requirements. Additional information will be coming in future newsletters. Note: The suggested size is very important. It is a guideline but too big or too small or too heavy is not good. See us at open shop.

Again this year we will be taken all bowls turned in before SWAT to SWAT for display. More details to follow. We took over 20 bowls last year and they were outstanding. We got a lot of great compliments.

EMPTY BOWLS

Empty Bowls is an annual fund raising event for the Tarrant Area Food Bank. The Food Bank provides food to sister agencies in 13 surrounding counties. The sister agencies then provide the food to needy children and families. Patrons at the Empty Bowls event pay \$65 or more and get to choose a bowl (wood, ceramic or glass) to take home and sample food from numerous booths of local restaurants. There are also numerous corporate sponsors that provide a sizeable portion of the total donations. This last February the event raised \$241 thousand, which is slightly more than last year. The next Empty Bowls event will be March 7, 2018.

We have accumulated 192 bowls and sixteen other items. Wayne Clowers and Bill Holt turned in there bowl collections they had accumulalted over several months. Wayne even turned in a 15 inch bowl. I can't even get that on my lathe. We added a few new doners so the percentage of members making donations went up to 13%.

We have this month and the February meeting to contirbute bowls. So, if you want to be on this years list head out to that shop and do one or two for Empty Bowls.
