Hollow Forms The Easy Way by Lyle Jamieson

Lyle's first experience with turning came as a child. He did all kinds of woodworking mentored by his father. In 1988, the woodworking tools got left behind...for turning.

Lyle is the inventor/creator of the Jamieson Hollow Form Turning System for safer, in-control hollowing that is fun too. The system creates a rest behind the main tool rest which simplifies the hollowing process. A turner can stand beside the lathe and gently guide the cutter into the vessel with fingertip control. One advantage is the use of a laser beam measuring devise to accurately measure wall thickness of hollow forms. This makes hollowing fun and easy, no need to work hard anymore.

Lyle Jamieson's turned figurative sculptures adorn the shelves and displays cases of museums, patrons, and institutions around the world.

Lyle is also an accomplished teacher of woodturning technique, when

teaching, Lyle concentrates on the process of turning in contrast to the product. What is the difference between a beginning turner and an advanced turner? It is what they do with the basics.

Lyle will cover the entire process of hollow form turning. He will cover the foundation elements as well as challenging the advanced turner to fine tune techniques. Lyle welcomes any and all questions, that's what makes it fun. The more audience participation, the more territory he can cover. The presentation will cover, time permitting:

- Tool control for roughing
- Chucking methods
- Vibration issues
- Preventing catches
- Grain orientation advantages
- Boring bar tool control
- Boring bar limits
- Laser measuring techniques
- Finishing the inside bottom
- Torn out grain problems
- Cleaning out tool marks
- Reverse chucking Hollow forms
- Finishing methods



Beads of Courage Program

This program is designed to support, strengthen and encourage children and families coping with serious illness. The program lets the children tell their story using colorful beads as meaningful symbols that commemorates milestones they have achieved along their treatment path. The average child gets 500 beads. The Woodturners of North Texas is taking on the challenge again this year.

Requirements

The lidded box/bowl interior diameter should be 6” (5” minimum diameter, 6” depth, 4” minimum). The lid should have a finial/knob that is easy for a child to grasp and not too elaborate. The ‘Beads of Courage’ logo bead to be placed inside or outside will be available at the meeting or can be mailed to you upon request. The “Beads of Courage” inscription can also be engraved or burned in the lid and can be placed inside or outside of the lid (no political or religious undertones are accepted). Customarily your box or bowl will be taken to SWAT and displayed along with the others from the club. Your thanks is knowing a very ill child is getting something that will help them through difficult times.


