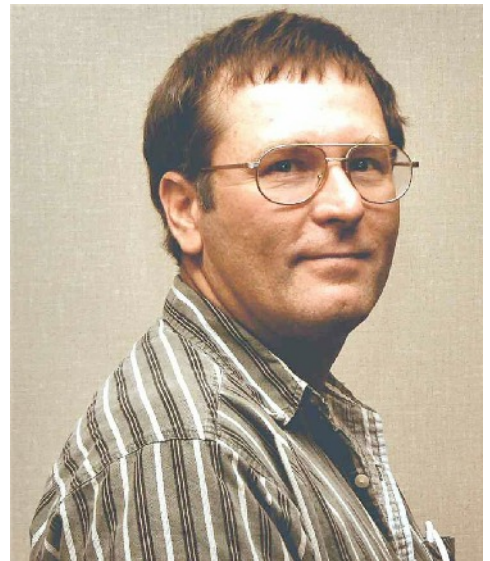

I plan on doing a demo on "Hollow Form Process". This will involve mounting a blank between centers, turning a tenon, and rough shaping. I will put the piece in a chuck, dress up the upper outside and hollow the interior with hand-held tooling. To



make the process interesting to viewers (and much faster), the blank will have multiple

holes drilled in it. Your camera should be able to show the tool inside the hollow form. The lower portion of the outside will be shaped after most of
