Pleas McKee

Finishing the Bottoms of Bowls

For our November Demonstration, Pleas McKee will present a program on techniques for finishing the bottoms of bowls.

Pleas began turning in 1989 after he saw a picture of one of Todd Hoyer's wing vessels. He did not know anybody else who did woodturning at the time so he taught himself. Pleas used the tools off and on for about six years before learning their names. And then, by chance, he

heard about Texas Turn-or-Two and went to see what other people were turning. After that, life has not been quite the same for Pleas McKee.

Pleas taught wood shop at a middle school (7th and 8th grade) for ten years and learned to teach woodturning to beginners. All of his demonstrations are geared for beginning students and reflect safety, proper tool use, majoring on the minors, if you will. He has been fascinated with finishing the bottoms of turnings and has used four techniques to produce them.

Pleas McKee's will demonstrate the three methods that he is the most comfortable with using: the jam chuck, donut, and Cole (or Jumbo) jaws. He will also discuss making, pros/cons, and demonstrate them in turning. While these are not the only methods, we are all still learning about woodturning, and as this is an interactive demonstration, club members are encouraged to ask questions, share experiences, and explore new ideas with the demonstrator!



Empty Bowls 2006

A large number of club members reported in at the "mandatory" meeting at Larry Robert's shop on Saturday, October 29 and Sunday, October 30 to have fun turning bowls and do something worthwhile for many folks who really need it. The "mandatory" meeting was a Bowl Turning Workshop Day to kick off our support for the Empty Bowls Project annual fund raiser in February.

The Tarrant Area Food Bank will hold their annual Empty Bowls fund-raiser event on Friday, February 24th, 2006 at the Bass Hall and Maddox/Muse Complex in downtown Fort Worth. Empty Bowls is a benefit luncheon in which attendees are served soup, bread and desserts donated by local restaurants and food merchants. There is a ticket charge of \$25 for lunch that includes one bowl for each attendee. The bowls are donated by area artists and are displayed on tables in the hall where attendees may review them and choose one to take home. The Empty Bowls web site is www.emptybowls.org.

There will also be a "bump table" where attendees can choose a better quality bowl for an additional fee. A silent auction is also held where attendees may bid on gallery works.

WNT members have participated in this event for the past several years and we have learned that wood bowls are very popular. This year we would like to substantially increase our donation of bowls. We will not set a target number but we should be able to donate several hundred bowls.

With the coming of fall, it is time to get back in the shop. As you work on your projects, take time to make some bowls for this worthy cause.
