

which make the process easier, tips and techniques for avoiding tear out in void spaces, and lastly he will discuss finishing alternatives. His goal is to get the audience to think "outside the round". Turning a birdhouse is in itself pretty straight forward, but to make your ornaments special, there are as Captain Kirk liked to say on Star Trek, "always possibilities".

He will address some new approaches to tool selection and business end grinding. He uses a square ground Euro Gouge vice a roughing gouge for the basic shaping, and two detail gouges with double bevels for the shaping of the finials and acorns. He will also point out how the three-point tool provides an excellent method for adding relief in tight places. Other tools that will be presented include the Berger tool, 1/4" round Skew, the fluted Parting too, and special hollowing tools for the not so parallel alternative shapes.

Bill Meador's interest in woodturning began in 1976 at the State Fair in Bosie, Idaho as he watched a sales representative from Shopsmith turn some old fashioned clothes pins. At the time, pricing was out of his range, but the idea stuck. Almost twenty years later, at another fair in Albuquerque, New Mexico, he saw another Shopsmith demonstration and made the deal to purchase one with all the turning accessories. At the time, he had never seen a true lathe, nor did he know that there were turning chapters and clubs, or such a thing as the AAW. Shortly after getting his Shopsmith, he went to the local Woodworkers Supply store, and walked into a demonstration by the Albuquerque Chapter of the AAW, and the rest as they say is history. Bill has been turning for fourteen years, having used the Shopsmith, then moved on to a Delta, followed by a Nova, and finally the Powermatic. His turning interests are truly varied, as he makes everything from pens to hollow forms. He sees himself as more of a craftsman than artist, as he enjoys the challenge of a new technique as much an anything.
