## Hummingbird House

**Demonstrator: Ron Howe**

Ron Howe is a member of the Woodturners of North Texas and has been turning for about 10 years. Ron is a member of many of the other clubs in our area and has attended SWAT and several other hand's on retreats. Ron's focus on woodturning is to focus on shape and form and he likes to embellish his pieces with texture and color. We are happy to have Ron demonstrate for our club this month. He will be teaching us how to make a "Hummingbird House"



**\*\*disclaimer\*\*** Hummingbirds will not nest in an enclosed area. This is simply a small, novelty miniature bird house that can be used as a decoration or ornament.

This past summer Ron Howe attended the Ron Campbell Hands On Woodturning Retreat in Michigan and was able to learn the process he will be teaching to us in one of the hands-on demonstrations. Jerry Measimer who is a woodturner from North Carolina was one of the instructors for the hands on retreat. Some of you may have met Jerry this year at SWAT as he was demonstrating airbrushing techniques at the Spiracraft booth in the Exhibition area. Jerry came up with this design for a Hummingbird house. He has developed his own production turning system to fast track turning his Hummingbird houses and has the process down to where he can complete the project in a matter of minutes. He has turned and decorated over 5000 of his Hummingbird Houses.

Using the techniques he learned from Jerry, Ron Howe was able to reproduce a Hummingbird house that looks nearly identical to the pieces turned by Jerry Measimer. Ron has been able to turn several Hummingbird houses since learning the process this past summer. Now he has not even got close to number that Jerry has made. But he has been able to complete over 100



Hummingbird Houses. Ron will teach us the steps to make this project as well as a variety of ways to enhance the piece with texture and color using an airbrush.



The Library has switched from the old card system for accounting of the library Books and Videos to a computer system.

There are a few policies added to the Library Check-out system:

- A list of Books and Videos for Check-out will be available on line on our web site at ([WNTX.org](http://WNTX.org)) and at each meeting on the Library table. A printed list will also be available on the Library table during the Club meetings.
- Take special Note that each Book/Video has a designated ID #. This number matches an inventory number in the computer system.
- To RETURN Books and Videos, just place them in the RETURN box on the library table.

The Club has built a large library and it was built by the past librarians and Club Members. To be the Librarian of such a knowledge base is indeed a privilege. I want to share this Knowledge base with everyone in the Club. So, Peruse the list of Books and Videos check them out and enjoy.

# EMPTY BOWLS

Tarrant Area Food Bank (TAFB) has decided to continue the Empty Bowls fund raising event.

The Empty Bowls Event is a two-hour lunch time event held once a year. This year's Event is on Friday, April 29, from 11:00AM to 1:00PM. A general admission ticket this year is \$100. All tickets include tastings and your selection of a handcrafted bowl. You can also get a VIP ticket for \$150 and get early admission at 10:30 to get first choice of bowls. The admission is considered a donation to TAFB. Besides many wood, ceramic and glass bowls, they have numerous food tasting booths sponsored by local restaurants. Believe me, you can get full eating lots of little bites of food. In the past there was even Blue Bell ice cream for dessert.

In 2020, the EB Event was cancelled several days before the scheduled day because of COVID concerns. All of the various bowls had been packed in preparation to move to the Will Rogers Memorial Center. Those are the same bowls that will be available this April 29<sup>th</sup>. That batch of bowls includes 200 wood bowls and 26 other turnings from WNT. David Baulch contributed the most bowls that year at 15.


WNT has also historically had a top turning demonstration at the EB Event. A TAFB officer said they would really like to have that type of demonstration again this year. In the past we have had three small lathes and six turners for the top turning demonstration. That allows us time to walk around and check out the bowls and sample food. The tops are given out to the people and we have a donation box for TAFB.

The WNT Board has agreed that Empty Bowls is a very worthy activity and should be supported by the Club.

I will be collecting bowl donations at our monthly meetings. Please only contribute quality bowls. The people attending the EB Event are paying a healthy sum and we should not insult them with a poor-quality bowl.

### Beads of Courage Program

This program is designed to support, strengthen and encourage children and families coping with serious illness. The program lets the children tell their story using colorful beads as meaningful symbols that commemorates milestones they have achieved along their treatment path. The average child gets 500 beads. The Woodturners of North Texas is taking on the challenge again this year.

### Requirements

The lidded box/bowl interior diameter should be 6” (5” minimum diameter, 6” depth, 4” minimum). The lid should have a finial/knob that is easy for a child to grasp and not too elaborate. The ‘Beads of Courage’ logo bead to be placed inside or outside will be available at the meeting or can be mailed to you upon request. The “Beads of Courage” inscription can also be engraved or burned in the lid and can be placed inside or outside of the lid (no political or religious undertones are accepted). Customarily your box or bowl will be taken to SWAT and displayed along with the others from the club. Your thanks is knowing a very ill child is getting something that will help them through difficult times.
