President's Notes for February, 2023

Have you checked your progress?

Kathy and I are getting ready to do an Art and Craft show, so we have a plan to offer a few recent pieces, and make some new to sell. In preparation for making a batch of new products we have been doing some cleaning and reorganizing of our shop and storage area. Things seem to just degenerate when I don't pay attention to order. As part of our reorganization, we went through some long-hidden storage bins, and came across a bunch of pieces we had just boxed up and forgotten about. We unwrapped each piece, and it gave us an opportunity look into the past and see what kind of work we had done when we first started turning in late 2014.

The good news is that it wasn't embarrassing. I could see features and finishes in my work that I would do differently today. I could see places where I would have oriented a bowl blank differently. I would have some different form/proportions on some pieces. I definitely have improved the way I sign my work, particularly since I added a laser to my tool armada. All in all, though, I wasn't displeased with my early work.

This review process has been extremely valuable in helping me see where I have come from in 7+ years, but also to think about what new directions I want to go with my new projects. For example, I am working on adding more texture and color to my projects, so I have spent some time watching demos and talking to the demonstrators at the Florida Woodturning Symposium who have generously shared their knowledge with me. I have a new compass heading for my woodturning adventure, and I plan to go that direction until there is reason to change.

So, here is my challenge:

- 1. Have you taken the time to review and self-critique your past work, and do you believe it was the best you could do at that time?
- 2. Do you fully understand how you would have done your past work differently?
- 3. Have you set a new compass heading so you continue to grow as a woodturner?
- 4. Have you spent time with other woodturners to help accelerate your growth process? Most woodturners are extraordinarily happy to share their knowledge. We belong to a very generous group.

When I first graduated from college and started working as an engineer, I was impressed with the experience of many of the engineers around me. One of the engineers I admired most shared generously on his thought processes and methods. He also shared that there was a significant difference between having 20 years of growth versus having 1 year of experience 20 times.

Which type of woodturner do you want to be?

Keep safe and keep turning.

The Process:

1. Turning the Form: Start with a blank of dry wood, mounted between centers on a wood lathe. Using a SRG, turn to round. Turn a tenon on one end for mounting in a 4-jaw chuck.

Mounted in the chuck, using a 3/8" spindle gouge or 3/8" bowl gouge, turn an 'egg' shape form, with the narrow part / egg top at the tailstock



end. Continue shaping the body of your form. Use a narrow parting tool to remove material near the chuck, to allow forming a flat base, tucking or chamfering the edge. Remove the egg form from the chuck, flip, and remount with the egg top side secure inside a vacuum drum chuck (no vacuum), and bring the tail stock up to hold securely. Finish the bottom cutting a slightly concave surface, and remove the small nub from the tailstock using a carving tool (powered rotary burr or palm carver).

2. Create the Pattern: The Wood Ffolkkes Wardrobe

Using a pencil, draw a pattern of your preference. Using a woodburning tip, burn over the lines that you draw, making them permanent.

Using a another woodburning tip that has been hand-made, shaped and sharpened, under-cut beneath each line. You can either use a rotary powered carver and narrow tip burr to remove material beneath each line (fast stock removal) or continue to use that woodburning tip to pyro-cave and shape the pattern.

With the same tip, held flat against the surface of the wood, move the tip in a circular motion to burn a slightly textured surface.

Using either a tooth brush or brass bristle jewelers brush, carefully remove the char from the wood, paying close attention to the under-cut areas.

3. Prep the Surface for your Color Palette

Using either India Ink or Black Leather Dye, paint the entire surface black, using compressed air to force the black pigment into small, tight spaces. Once this is dry, using either a flat or deerfoot brush, apply the base colors of black, gray, white using the dry-brush paint method.

- 4. Choose your color palette, applying several shades/layers of heavy body acrylic paint using the dry-brush paint method.
- 5. Allow acrylic paint to dry thoroughly before handling. The surface does not require a finish, however, you may wish to use a spray lacquer one week after the last layer on paint is applied.

Equipment/Tools/Machinery/Supplies

Wood: dry, straight grain, closed grain, closed pore. Preferred species are cherry, birch, sycamore or soft maple;

Power carver (Dremel, Micro-motor, Foredom, NSK Presto);

Narrow or tapered point burr (Saburr Tooth); or piercing burr (699L 1/16" shank)

Woodburning unit - must be 130 watts. The following brands meet that requirement:

- o Burnmaster Burnmaster Wood Burner
- o Detail Master (no longer commercially available),
- o Jacques Vesery Precision Burner;
- o A home-made unit following John Jordan or Graeme Priddle instructions on making one using a battery charger.

A woodburning handpiece that accepts wire tips; <u>Burnmaster</u> <u>Handpiece</u>

Fan with filter to draw away smoke; I use this one: GermGuardian It has both a charcoal and Hepa filter.

Leather glove to protect your dominant hand while woodburning;

Black India ink <u>Pebeo India Ink</u> or Black Leather Dye <u>Fiebings Pro Dye Black</u>;

Heavy Body Matte Acrylic Paint. I use Golden. Golden Acrylic (for sample). Base colors are black, gray, white.

Color palette of Golden Acrylic paint of your choice

Paint brushes: Flat or Deerfoot Style: flat <u>Flat acrylic paint</u> brush deerfoot <u>Deer Foot style brush</u>

Palette knife - metal <u>Metal Palette knife</u> or plastic <u>Plastic</u> <u>palette knife</u>;

Non-waxed paper plates for your paint palette (not plastic, cardboard or other fancy picnic gear).

Soft Brass Wire Brush (jewelers brush) <u>Soft Bristle Brass Brush</u> or tooth brush

Over-the-head magnifiers OptiVISOR Headband Magnifier



Beads of Courage Program

This program is designed to support, strengthen and encourage children and families coping with serious illness. The program lets the children tell their story using colorful beads as meaningful symbols that commemorates milestones they have achieved along their treatment path. The average child gets 500 beads. The Woodturners of North Texas is taking on the challenge again this year.

Requirements

The lidded box/bowl interior diameter should be 6" (5" minimum diameter, 6" depth, 4" minimum). The lid should have a finial/knob that is easy for a child to grasp and not too elaborate. The 'Beads of Courage' logo bead to be placed inside or outside will be available at the meeting or can be mailed to you upon request. The "Beads of Courage" inscription can also be engraved or burned in the lid and can be placed inside or outside of the lid (no political or religious undertones are accepted). Customarily your box or bowl will be taken to SWAT and displayed along with the others from the club. Your thanks is knowing a very ill child is getting something that will help them through difficult times.
