Tod Raines Bowl Coring



Bowl coring is the process of cutting one bowl blank from another. The use of special tooling is needed for this kind of process. Bowl coring typically is used by those turners that turn a lot of bowls perhaps in a production setting or as hobbyist turner that sells turnings. The cost of this special tooling may be prohibitive to the occasional user but the investment can pay for itself fairly quickly as the bowl yield increases from each harvest blank. Getting 3 or more bowls from each blank

is possible which can be a time saver and make the investment easier to


manage. The other benefit is that there is a lot less waste, which to bowl turners is a lot less shavings to clean up and get rid of.

So to be clear, I am a Woodcut Tools dealer and that is why I am demonstrating the Woodcut Bowlsaver products.



Bowl Coring

The two systems from Woodcut are the Bowlsaver Original:

Both systems use Stellite tipped curved blades that ride on a platform swivel plate that mounts on the lathe banjo via a tool post. Both units also utilize the tailstock quill for extra support. Both systems are solidly built, simple to set up and easy and safe to use. A laser Light Guide is an optional purchase for either system.

The (original) Woodcut Bowlsaver Coring System includes two high strength blades (used one at a time) with Stellite Cutters giving a combination of cuts that will remove bowls from 3" to 12" up to 5" deep from the inside of the mother bowl. It is meant for lathes with 12" to 16" swing with 1HP and up. Every lathe has a different diameter tool post so order a tool post to suit the lathe you are using.

The Bowlsaver Max4 Coring System is relatively new (Summer of 2022). This system is a much beefier and larger system than the Original. It has three high strength blades (used one at a time) with Stellite Cutters giving a combination of cuts that will core from 3" (75 mm) to 18" (450 mm). It is meant for lathes with a minimum of 1.5 hp lathe with a swing of 16" to 25".

https://woodturningtoolstore.com/product/bowlsaver-max4-coringsystem/ The one question that is always asked is do you core the small bowl first or the largest bowl first. The decision is yours. A couple of things to consider. If you are selling your bowls as a means of making a living then you typically can get more money for the larger bowls. So this means that you would want to ensure you get the largest bowl without mistake. Professional bowl turners will most always core the largest first. This means unmounting the large bowl then mounting the core and turning a tenon for the next coring operation. This takes a bit more time unless you have two lathes to work with. The easier way for most hobbyists is to core the small first and work from the middle outwards. This requires no change in mounting setup and you can core continuously until complete.

Some helpful coring tips and techniques.

- 1. Coring works best on green or wet wood.
- 2. Use a diamond hone and sharpen each cutter. Hone the top of the cutter a bit and then hone the front cutting edge. Be sure to not change the shape of the cutter. The trapezoidal shape to the cutter is important as the front two pointy corners act to clear the path wider than the blade.
- 3. If you core dry wood expect it to be a more difficult task. On dry wood adding a small negative rake on the top edge of the Stellite cutter will help. Use a fine hone and add the negative rake bevel.

EMPTY BOWLS

The Empty Bowls Event is a two-hour, lunch time fund raising event held once a year by the Tarrant Area Food Bank (TAFB). All tickets include food tastings from local restaurants and your selection of a handcrafted bowl. They have wood, glass, and ceramic bowls. Tickets for the event are \$100 or \$150 for early admittance. If you get in early, you get first pick for your bowl. The Event will be held on the last Friday of April. The last Event raised a record breaking \$272,000 and tickets were sold out.

The WNT Board has agreed that Empty Bowls is a very worthy activity and should be supported by the Club. Our Club contributes almost all of the wood bowls and provides a top turning demonstration at the event.

We are up to 118 bowls which is still a way from 150. We only have this month to complete our bowl donations for this cycle so please make a good effort.

I will be collecting bowl donations at our monthly meetings. Please only contribute quality bowls. The people attending the EB Event are paying a healthy sum and we should not insult them with a poor-quality bowl.
