Finishing Jim Combs

I have been turning for 25 years, plus or minus. And, in that time, I was a volunteer teacher at El Camino Jr. College. I was also teaching intermediate and beginning wood turning to our club members for five years. I started putting color on my work about 15+ years ago, starting off with the TransTint dyes. I then moved my way up to Createx Colors, a water-based acrylic paint.

My air brush of choice is an Aywata. I have been carving pieces for about 10 years.

For my demo, I will be quickly showing you some airbrushing techniques and also show how I put on my finishes, mostly using a clear lacquer. My lacquer of choice is a Minwax lacquer, which can be found at Lowe's Hardware. The Createx Colors can be found at Hobby Lobby in a limited assortment. The best place to look is for them is online.










FOLDABLE SAWBUCK (SAWHORSE)




MATERIAL LIST

EMPTY BOWLS

The Empty Bowls Event is a two-hour, lunch time fund raising event held once a year by the Tarrant Area Food Bank (TAFB). All tickets include food tastings from local restaurants and your selection of a handcrafted bowl. They have wood, glass, and ceramic bowls. Tickets for the event are \$100 or \$150 for early admittance. If you get in early, you get first pick for your bowl. The next Event will be held on Friday, April 24, 2026.

The last Event raised over \$300,000 and tickets were sold out. The WNT Board has agreed that Empty Bowls is a very worthy activity and should be supported by the Club. Our Club contributes almost all of the wood bowls and provides a top turning demonstration at the event.

Eureka is not easy to get to but the town was the center of the coast redwood lumber industry. The old downtown area is filled with amazing




