## End grain hollowing Blake Hickerson



Like many I was exposed to wood working at a young age. In junior high shop class, we could use the table saw and bandsaw, but the lathe in the corner was dangerous and we were not allowed to use it. My uncle built and rebuilt furniture and had a lathe to make and reproduce spindles, so one day I asked how he did such work and he showed me.

Today I understand he was using gouges, scrapers, and a whole lot of sandpaper. Some 10-12 years later there was a joiner advertised in the paper for sale and at the time I was doing flat work. I went to purchase the joiner and the guy also had a lathe for sale for only ten dollars; it also came home with me. Like with my uncle, I scraped and sanded until one day when I went to Packstons Hardwoods on Berry Street to purchase some wood for a project I was making. The salesman told me of the Woodturners of North Texas and the AAW; this was in the 1989/1990 era. That introduction to WNT catapulted my woodturning adventures.

The following year I attended the AAW Symposium in Greensboro, North Carolina and the Texas Turn or Two at the Maricopa Ranch at Canyon Lake, Texas. The following year, I attended the AAW symposium that was in San Antonio. After that event, I applied for an AAW education grant and was selected as one of the winners; I went to David Ellsworth's for a three-day class in Bucks County, PA; I came home with a bowl gouge, sharpening fixture, David's straight and bent hollowing tools, and a whole lot of turning techniques.

Looking back at the advances in techniques for hollowing end grain, I want to focus my demonstration on:

- 1. Scraping tools of various designs and manufactures
- 2. Hook tool, both homemade and the Andre Martel design, now Michael Hosaluk design
- 3. The ONEWAY Termite tool Why end grain hollowing? Whether you are turning a simple box or a hollow form, the grain orientation finds you hollowing directly into end grain, which can be challenging and tedious at best. I hope this gives you insights to how to make the process easier when taking on an end grain project.

#### END GRAIN HOLLOWING

When end grain hollowing because you are cutting the end grain fibers you want to start at the center and cut across the fibers where the fibers are supporting the cut as you come across with the cut.

Unlike when you are hollowing cross grain where you use a bowl gouge you use your spindle gouge.

- 1. Spindle gouge cutting against the grain you get torn grain
- Spindle gouge with the grain no bevel support and a shearing cut
- 3. Carbide tool Center out with a shear scraping cut
- 4. Ray Key special ground spindle gouge with a bevel riding cut. The bevel on the gouge is ground at a 50-degree angle.
- Richard Raffan back hollowing method followed with a shear scraper to clean up the surface of the wood.
- 6. ONEWAY Termite tool, which is a ring tool that can be used both in the forward and reverse rotation of the lathe. An alternate method to sharpening the tool from the white stone mounter in a router you can use a diamond file to sharpen the cutting edge.
- 7. Hook tool A tool that you can make yourself or the Andre Martel designed tool that Michael Hosaluk now markets. The Andre Martel tool can be purchased from Woodworker Specialties. The Michael Hosaluk tool is available from Tod Raines at the Woodturning Tool Store. One also sharpens the hook tool with the diamond hone.




















































## Last Month's demonstration
